Decisions to be made/considered before meeting with our Funeral Director

The following list is just some of the many items for which we will need decisions, to enable us to tailor the funeral arrangements to your wishes. Rather than having to make hasty decisions during our meeting, you may wish to give some consideration to the following or perhaps discuss them with other family members.

- Location of any church service.
- Location of any cremation service.
- Which comes first, the cremation or the church service.
- Choice of hymns.
- Choice of charity (if donations in lieu of flowers).
- Are family organising main floral tribute directly with the florist or through Forsey and Son?
- Number of family members requiring transportation provided by us.
- Are service sheets required, if so, how many? The majority of the cost is in setting up the printing and not quite so much the numbers printed. Therefore, we strongly suggest you ask us to print far too many, rather than not enough
- Press notices
 - What type of notice:- death notice, acknowledgement, obituary report
 - Which newspapers
 - Wording for notices
- Do you wish to have the names of those attending the main service to be recorded for your reference?
- Do you wish to have an obituary, with or without a list of those attending the service, inserted in the local weekly paper?
- If cremation, are ashes to be scattered or interred and if so where and when?
- Details of any existing grave to be used (i.e. grave number, location, name and dates of death of any previous burial in the grave)
- Is there any memorial on any existing grave being considered for use?

Obviously we will guide you on any matters for which you are unsure. This list is provided in the hope of relieving some of the decision making pressure, before our meeting.
